

## **Metals and alloys – Atmospheric corrosion testing – General requirements for field tests (ISO 8565:1992)**

The European Standard EN ISO 8565:1995 has the status of a Swedish Standard. EN ISO 8565 endorses ISO 8565:1992, in Sweden published as SS-ISO 8565, edition 1.
